

Statement from Emily Edenshaw, Tribal Administrator/CEO, Ketchikan Indian Community

Ketchikan Indian Community was recently contacted by a reporter from the Sitka Sentinel regarding an alleged incident that took place approximately 14 years ago.

We appreciate the reporter reaching out and providing the opportunity to respond; however, as a matter of policy and respect for privacy, KIC does not comment on past or current employee matters.

At the same time, we recognize that conversations like these can be difficult and may surface painful experiences for survivors. Anyone impacted by sexual abuse or violence deserves support, care, and access to resources.
